Regional Management Board Report

To our Netball South Netball family – a big thank you to everyone who volunteered in 2024-25 across the Region to enable and grow our sport - players, coaches, officials, team managers, parents, committee members. The successes we have had at local, county, regional and national levels could not have happened without your passion and commitment.

After serving the Region, firstly as a Board member and then chair for over 4 years, Julie Tucker stood down in the autumn of 2024. We should like to thank her for her work in leading both the RMB and netballers across the South over that time and wish her well for the future. (She remains involved in Netball South governance through her role as North Bucks County chair).

As a result of vacancies and limited capacity, the last year has not been easy for RMB members, some of whom have been covering the business of vacant roles. Despite this, much has been achieved with the support of the EN regional team Zoe Barrett (maternity cover for our NS regional officer), Lucy (regional officer) and Amy Stewart (partnership manager). Amy Stewart and Zoe will both be working in Netball South-West only from September. We would like to thank Amy, in particular, for her hard work, advocacy and friendship to our region over many years.

Many thanks and great tribute must also be given to vice chair Toni Brunsdon who stepped into the breach during the year as interim chair as well as leading the Competitions TSG. With support from Jo and Lindsay, all regional business and representation commitments have been fulfilled.

During 2024-25 we have made great efforts to re-engage with county committees. Three 1hr meetings have been held since February enabling the sharing of information, ideas and achievements. Some examples of mutual support have also emerged as a result of these meetings. We have also used them as an opportunity to introduce our newly recruited members of the RMB.

The stage is set for another successful season in 2025-26 which in February 2026 marks the beginning of England Netball's Centenary Year – a great opportunity to both celebrate the pioneers from our sport's history as well as looking at ways to make it sustainable for the next 100 years. 1. Rearrangements (2024/25 Season)


- a. U13 3 games rearranged due to the weather and 2 as mutually agreed by teams

2. Game Management (2024/25 Season)


• There were 162 cases of game management recorded this season, recorded against 132 different players. These have been applied by 65 different umpires.

- 22 teams have registered an intent to enter the U14 entry tournament
- 27 teams have registered an intent to enter the U16 entry tournament

Netball South Officiating Report 2024/2025

NS Open & U19 Leagues

The 2024/2025 proved to be challenging with umpire availability. However, all fixtures were completed with minor rearrangements for the U19s. The 1 September 2024 also saw the implementation of the Amended Rules, with a significant change to Game Management. Umpires have handled this well, but it has also proved challenging for the teams to come to terms with.

Umpire Achievements

With the introduction of the NSL 2.0 Superleague and NXTGEN for U23s this season, umpires in the South have had very limited opportunities given to them, as the squad numbers were reduced.

Emma Izon-Siskin, Lisa Vallely and Emma Walker were all given the opportunity to be a Reserve Umpire at Superleague matches.

Emma, Lisa, Emma and Rebecca Moher were all appointed to NXTGEN games.

Lisa Vallely was appointed to travel to St Kitts to officiate at the USA Men's Netball Championships. Kylie Woodhead and Alice Johnson were appointed to the National Premier League Play-offs, with Kylie being appointed to one of the Finals.

Rebecca Moher, Laura Stunell, Mae Holmes and Erin Graham were appointed to the National Schools Finals, with Erin being appointed to one of the U14 Semi Finals.

Erin Graham, Helen Bond and Megan Pratt were appointed to the National U16 Club Finals.

Alice and Liv Johnson, Nicola Bolton and Liz Sywyj were appointed to the National U14 Club Finals. We have had another successful season of umpires attaining either their A or B Award level with Helen Bond achieving her A Ward and the Olivia (Lolly) Macdonald, Maria Thorley, Diane Long, Shannon Cooney, Martha Simons, Laura Thurow, Stacey Wilson and Connor Sharod-Southam achieving their B Awards.

Each County in the South recorded a high number of Into Officiating and C Award successes.

Governance Report

KEY HIGHLIGHTS FOR TIME PERIOD – 1 May 2024 to 30 Apr 2025

- 1. The Region submitted key governance documents to England Netball on 31 March 2024 as evidence of good governance as recommended by Tier 1 of Sport England's Code of Governance. 4 of our counties did likewise. Feedback has been received from EN on the Region's submission and a couple of small improvements to the Region's governance are being actioned. No feedback received by Counties as yet.
- 2. RMB Volunteer recruitment a campaign in December and January 2025 successfully recruited three new Board members enhancing our current skill base. Lindsay Filiata, Melissa Piggott and Dawn Williamson joined the Board in March as Performance / coaching lead, Media and Marketing lead and General member with business strategy expertise respectively. All of these areas had been covered by current Board members over recent years and we
- 3. **Confidential legal advice** has been provided to both the RMB and members of Netball South as requested by Jeremy Pendlebury (RMB member with legal expertise).

4. Confidential matters of concern referred or dealt with in accordance appropriate timelines. There was a significant increase in MOC (35) plus some subsequent appeals. A confidential log is retained and also a record of experienced panel members who have supported the process. Areas of complaint include coaches, officials, league administration and potential safeguarding matters. The RMB's thanks goes especially to Carolyn Davies for her work as Resolutions officer and all panel members both from Netball South and beyond.

We look to make continuous improvements as a result of matters of concern raised by members when appropriate. For example, we are following up on an appeals form for Competition sanctions.

- 5. Our NS One Awards Event was a successful celebration and recognition of the work of our volunteers. It was organised and delivered on 21 June 2025 at Gorse Hill Hotel, Woking.. 138 guests enjoyed the afternoon. We had 81 One Award nominations for 10 award categories. Our thanks to everyone for attending and to the panel members for giving up their time to read through and score the anonymised nominations. Thanks also to both Lucy Cusack our regional officer and Zoe Barratt (Lucy's maternity cover to April 2025) for their significant contribution to the event's success.
- 6. The **2025 Netball South's Presidents Award** was given to Eagles Netball Club for their outstanding achievement in winning the Under 16s National Clubs tournament and securing bronze medals in the Under 14 age category. A wonderful achievement for all the young athletes and their coaches.
- 7. **EDI and Netball HER** see separate report below. Our thanks to Amie Hing-Gibbs for her work in this area.
- 8. Youth representative Millie Waite has been involved in many areas of the Region's work over the last year including supporting regional competitions, One Awards event volunteering and being a One Awards panel member. She provides the voice of young people around the table and is developing more and more confidence in understanding what goes on behind the scenes of NS regional business.

The 2024/25 year has been a pivotal one for Equality, Diversity & Inclusion (EDI) in our sport. We've made significant strides in refining guidelines for different playing categories, providing greater clarity and inclusivity across all levels of the game.

One of the year's standout successes has been the continued growth of **NetballHer**, which gained strong visibility and support through the Super League. We've also deepened our focus on **safeguarding** and **mental health**, recognising their vital roles in creating safe, supportive environments for all participants. This year saw the introduction of **purple wear** for **International Women's Day**—a new initiative designed to raise both awareness and funds. While we didn't hit our fundraising target, the campaign laid solid groundwork, and we're confident we can expand its reach and impact in 25/26. Importantly, all funds raised were donated to the **World Netball Foundation**, helping to grow and support netball communities globally.

Looking ahead, 2025/26 is shaping up to be an exciting year. We anticipate growth in **mixed**, **boys'**, and **men's netball**, as category guidelines evolve and awareness increases. We're also planning deeper



collaboration with NetballHer, alongside renewed efforts for **International Women's Day** and the exploration of additional events to promote EDI principles across the sport.

Together, we continue to build a more inclusive and equitable future for everyone in netball.

Firstly, we would like to extend a huge heartfelt Thank You from England Netball to each and every Netball South Member for your continued support, passion and dedication you have shown for our wonderful sport throughout 2024/25.

National highlights:

Gender Policy - England Netball have published the Gender Eligibility & Participation Policy that will come into effect across the game from 1st September 2025 and includes information relating to transgender players. We are now working to support the Netball Family to ensure that netball facilitators are adequately prepared for the upcoming season. Until this time, the Trans Inclusion Guidance which was last updated in August 2024 remains in place. England Netball | Gender Eligibility and Participation Policy

2026 Commonwealth Games - Glasgow 2026 will feature a 10-sport programme which, along with netball, will feature Athletics and Para Athletics (Track & Field), Swimming and Para Swimming, Artistic Gymnastics, Track Cycling and Para Track Cycling, Weightlifting and Para Powerlifting, Boxing, Bowls, Para Bowls and 3×3 Basketball and 3×3 Wheelchair Basketball.

NETBALLher launch advisory board - Led by Kelly Gordon, Chair and Executive Lead for NETBALLHer at England Netball, the NETBALLHer Advisory Board includes system leaders with the vision to push boundaries and drive progress across the sector. Uniting an exceptional group of leaders with influence and experience working across grassroots sport, health, governance, policy, elite sport, law and advocacy, all of whom are dedicated to advancing opportunities for women and girls.

I'm delighted to confirm that Kelly will be staying with EN as Executive Lead for NETBALLHer and will also be supporting with the embedding of our Working as One initiative locally (more details will be shared shortly). Kelly will be working an average of 2 days per week (Mon & Tues).

Tournaments and Events:

<u>The Netball Performance League</u> (NPL) Tournament was held at the University of Nottingham. The tournament provides an opportunity for talented young athletes to compete in a highly disciplined and intense tournament at the end of the NPL season. Loughborough Lightning lifted the U21 NPL Tournament trophy and London Pulse taking the top spot in the U19 and U17 age groups.

<u>National Schools</u> - Hartpury College (U19) and Putney High (U16) have retained their 2024 titles at the 2025 National Schools Finals, in association with the British Army with Yarm School winnig the U14 age group



<u>National Clubs</u> - Eagles have been crowned champions of the 2025 U16 National Clubs Finals, in association with the British Army.

<u>Premier League Champions</u> - Oldham Netball Club (PL1), The Downs Netball Club (PL2) and Blackpool Netball Club (PL3) have taken the 2024-25 Premier League titles. .

National and Regional One Awards:

The 2025 Regional One Awards is due to take place on 22nd June at Gorse HIll Hotel, Woking. The Region received 81 independant nominees across all 10 categories with circa 140 guests due to attend the Afternoon Tea and presentation event. A huge congratulations to everyone nominated.

The National event is due to take place on Saturday 18th October, the venue is yet to be confirmed.

England Vitality Roses:

The Vitality Roses have had a busy season with numerous fixtures against the top ranking nations. They maintain their World ranking of 4th despite a brief period of hold 2nd place.

<u>Three match test series vs Diamonds in Australia</u> (Sept 2024) - Australia claimed the test win 2-1 but only after the Vitality Roses took it to a deciding third game after only their second ever win over Australia, in Australia.

<u>Vitality Roses win 2024 Taini Jamison Trophy in New Zealand</u> (Sept-Oct 2024) Having already secured the Taini Jamison Trophy with back-to-back wins against the Silver Ferns in game one and two of the series, the third and final game saw New Zealand take the win 61-56 against the Vitality Roses.

This series win marked the first time that England has won the Taini Jamison Trophy since 2021, and the first time England has ever won a test series in New Zealand within the first two games.

<u>Fast 5</u> - The Vitality Roses have finished fifth at the FAST5 Netball World Series 2024 after a hard-fought weekend of competition

<u>Netball Nations Cup</u> - England captured their first-ever Vitality Netball Nations Cup in Feb 2025, After two thrilling weekends of Vitality Netball Nations Cup action in Nottingham's Motorpoint Arena and London's Copper Box Arena, the Vitality Roses stormed to victory and lifted the trophy in front of a sold-out crowd.

In early 2025, the Roses finally won the Netball Quad/Nations Cup after five prior runner-up finishes

<u>England U17 (Young Roses)</u> - They swept the 2024 U17 Europe Netball Division 1 Championship England's U17 squad previously won the competition in 2024 in a tournament that saw the side go unbeaten throughout – and they repeated that feat, this time with a new-look squad.



<u>Netball Horizon Series November 2024</u>- This is a four-year series that will be held across England and Jamaica, with two home matches to be played in England and two away matches played in Jamaica for the next four years. Jamaica lifted the <u>Rhone Hornsby Trophy</u> in the inaugural Vitality Netball Horizon Series after a 61-53 victory in the decider. With both sides having recorded one win apiece and a draw, the stage was set for a tantalising finale at the National Indoor Sports Centre in Kingston.

<u>Netball Reimagined/ Netball Super league 2.0</u> - On International Women's Day we held the first ever Netball Super Cup at Sheffield's Utilita Arena. This event marks the start of the relaunched Netball Super League, a moment that so many colleagues across the organisation have been working incredibly hard towards for a long time The revamped Netball Super League (NSL "2.0") launched in March 2025:

Reduced squad sizes, fully professionalised contracts.

Average player salary rose ~82%.

Nxt Gen League - New U23 League and Player Pathway Structure Announced for 2024/25 As part of the Netball Super League (NSL) relaunch, England Netball has confirmed the introduction of a new U23 feeder league to strengthen the talent pipeline and support emerging players.

Key features include:

Nine teams: Eight aligned with NSL franchises (Birmingham Panthers, Cardiff Dragons, Leeds Rhinos, London Mavericks, London Pulse, Loughborough Lightning, Manchester Thunder, Nottingham Forest Netball) plus Team Bath by invitation.

Target group: Primarily for U23 athletes, with up to four over-age players allowed per squad to support transition and return to elite play (e.g. post-injury or maternity).

Format: Home-and-away fixtures starting February 2025, aligned with NSL matches where possible.

Squads: 16–20 players; U23 athletes may be called up to NSL as Temporary Replacement Players, with match fees and additional compensation.

Registration: NSL signing window closed end of August; U23 registration follows. Club trials to be announced.

This league was developed following an independent review and stakeholder consultation, ensuring continued elite opportunities amid NSL structural changes. It will sit within a broader national player pathway network across U15, U17, U19, and now U23 levels, ensuring consistent access to high-quality coaching and competition across the country.

Regional Highlights:

Targeting Muslim and Asian Women and Girls (Debbie Spindlow, Berkshire NDO) -

We know we have a larger than average Asian population in Windsor and Maidenhead and that Cosmopolitan Roses Netball Academy (CRNA) were doing some great work in targeting Muslim women to get into the sport and to flourish in a performance environment. We approached them



about setting up Back to Netball sessions and trying to encourage more local women to play netball and worked together to apply for funding from Berkshire Community Foundation.

We were successful in getting almost £2.5k and used this to set up an Open Day to give women and girls from local mosques the opportunity to try netball. As a result we had some great demand and had almost 50 women and girls attend. We subsequently tried to find a venue for evening Back to Netball sessions that allowed us to cover windows and doors so ladies could remove hijabs and abayas and play safely whilst maintaining their modesty. Unfortunately, this wasn't the easiest of tasks but we were able to find outdoor venue so juniors could start playing.

Eventually we were able to find a school that would open up in the evenings. As a result there are currently 51 women and girls playing junior and adult netball at Newlands School in Maidenhead. The funding was used to purchase equipment and pay towards court hire and coaching/umpiring costs. We also used some of the funding to pay towards coaching and umpiring course fees to ensure the club can continue to grow.

A mosque in Reading heard about the work we were doing and contacted us to put on netball sessions. I was able to find a coach to deliver on their behalf and we are now hoping to arrange some friendlies between the two groups.

Women from the netball sessions have felt fitter, lost weight and have noted on their improved mental health and wellbeing as a result of netball. We have new coaches and umpires in the area and CRNA have forged partnerships with organisations such as London Pulse who are supporting them in providing the Pakistan Netball Academy linked to the Pakistan National Team.

There is a big demand and passion for netball within the Muslim and Asian population and I'd love to continue to support the growth of this. One thing I've also learnt is the number of home schooled Muslim girls there are in Maidenhead, Windsor and Slough and am looking to grow my coaching workforce to be able to provide some "home school" netball sessions.

<u>Thakeham funding for Walking Netball (Care McCormick, Hampshire)</u> - Carey worked with EN commercial team to bring to life some of our partner funding from Thakeham Group. With the £1000 funding received / split to run two purposeful programs. A Walking Netball session and New Year Festival aligned to our priorities. Both opportunities have been successful, engaging with over 200 people.

Engagement since inception in September for our WN programme saw 30 ladies engaged with 28 of these being New to Netball and a throughput of 228 attendances .





COUNTY REPORTS

Berkshire

Berkshire Netball Chair's Report 2024/25 There is so much great work going on in Berkshire within the leagues, clubs and communities to provide so many different opportunities for people to get involved with netball as players, officials, coaches, team managers and other volunteering opportunities. Something for everyone! A few things to mention from the past year:-

- Following completion of the Tier 1 Governance review which we reported on last year, we are still waiting for feedback from England Netball to help us plan for the future.
- Berkshire Junior Netball League just seems to go from strength to strength with was once again a huge success with teams from across Berkshire and beyond enjoying regular matches at various venues across the county. Thank you to Kate Maxfield who, together with her sub-committee, worked tirelessly to ensure that so many young players had the opportunity to compete on a regular basis.
- In addition to the winter league, a friendly summer league is also taking place to give teams the chance to keep playing regular netball.
- Berkshire Netball continued to run 2 x U13 and 2 x U15 Player Development Programmes as part of the England Netball Player Pathway. We welcomed Katie Fisher to the coaching team who was a great addition with her experience of the Player Pathway. This year saw additional training opportunities outside of the pathway with the creation of the fortnightly U13 and U15 Academies for those players who just missed out on a place in the PDPs.
- Berkshire Netball continued to provide financial support to clubs and individuals with a number of bursaries awarded during the year, particularly for new coaches being supported with the cost of their courses.
- Berkshire's Officiating Lead, Mary Stanley, together with her team of mentors and assessors, oversaw the development of many umpires within the county at all levels which has resulted in many new umpires gaining their qualifications this year.
- Berkshire's NDO, Debbie Spindlow, has once again provided excellent support and advice to the Board as well as delivering her own extensive work programme within the county. We are very grateful to her for all her hard work and enthusiasm and unwavering support for Netball in Berkshire.
- Berkshire clubs were well-represented in the Netball South regional leagues again this season with Eagles, Royals, Athena Bs, Woodley, Bs and Magnet all competing in various age groups. Eagles qualified in both U14 and U16 age groups and went through to the finals of the National Clubs competition with their U16s being the first Berkshire team in over ten years to lift the trophy and their U14s taking third place in their final. Berkshire Netball were delighted to provide bursaries to help with the cost of attending the finals.
- Wellington College U19s qualified through the county and regional rounds to go on to play at National Schools Finals in Sheffield to represent Berkshire and Netball South.
- Berkshire officials have once again been heavily involved with the NSL this season fulfilling roles as technical officials/umpires etc.
- Our Safeguarding Officer, Christina Turton-Berenger, has been busy keeping everyone up to date and supporting all our teams/leagues to ensure they are compliant with EN requirements. Thank you to everyone on the Board and to everyone involved with netball in Berkshire and to all the amazing people who help to make all of this happen. The dedication and hard work of all



those who help to deliver netball in the county is undoubtedly appreciated by all of those that benefit from it

Hampshire

Firstly, before saying anything about this year's achievements, the Hampshire Committee have whilst being a small group continued to deliver a fantastic league and opportunities for our players throughout the county.

We recently advertised for new members to fill some vacant positions and an update on trying to develop a succession plan for all roles as we all complete the recommended number of years and beyond. We all love what we do but we are very conscious that there is a need to have new people and new ideas to take things forward for the good of County Netball and the future of the sport.

This year we continued to spend a lot of our time developing our governance and reaching the expectations of Tier 1 for governance. As part of this we have had to review how we do things, our risk maps, our skill set and many other processes and documents.

This year we have agreed to provide a cash sum of £1000 to each of our 8 leagues to allow them to use in a manner that supports the growth of netball in their area. We are looking forward to hearing what the money has been used for and how it has made an impact in the local area. FINANCE

Bursaries have been awarded this year as per our criteria. We have decided that our Affiliation Fees for 2025 – 2026 will be zero per adult and junior.

LEAGUES

The 2024-25 season has run smoothly for both Seniors and Juniors. Although it was looked at, it was not possible to allocate umpires this season

Intent to enter next season forms have been sent to all senior and junior teams.

Entry forms, amended rules will be sent to teams and be put on the website as soon as we can confirm dates

Pulse Premier won Division one and represented Hampshire in the play offs for Regional Division 3 and were successful and we wish them luck in the Regional League. Swan won the under 19 League but are ineligible to enter the Regional Play Offs so Team Force represented Hampshire. Again this year we ran the National Schools.

UMPIRING

This year has continued to be a difficult year for Officiating for the County as well as for leagues. There is a lack of experienced umpires and those looking to develop their skills offering to do Hampshire Games and for leagues that the lack of grass roots umpires continues to cause issues of being able to cover matches.

We have been assessing umpires as quickly as we can and In Hampshire from April 24 to end March 25 we have had 21 new C Award umpires which is 2 more than last year and but this



continues to be a drop in numbers to what we were seeing pre COVID. In addition, we have had 63 umpires pass their Into Officiating awards which is 7 more than the previous year.

A Huge Congratulations to all our new umpires

As you may be aware all courses are now run by EN on line and to become an umpire you must firstly complete an Into Officiating Course and assessment and then do your C Award Course. In 2024 64 people attended the Into Course and 70 have either attended this year or are booked to attended before the summer. Unfortunately, in the same period only a 41 people have subsequently booked on to a C Award course or 9 are booked for before the summer this year. We will be working with umpires to see what we can do to support more moving to this next stage. We are aware that a number of leagues are doing all they can to encourage this as well and holding specific events during the summer season to get more people involved in umpiring. We are aware that the costs of becoming an umpire have now increased and our leagues are continuing to support those working to the Into Officiating level and the county does have bursaries to assist for C and above.

We now have 16 Assessors within Hampshire, and 2 new Assessors are currently on their journey to join the workforce, Jeannie Brumhill and Julie Gailer.

We would like to thank all the assessors who have supported the Councy and continue to do so, Chris Granger, Christine Backshell, Mandy Gerrard, Gary Holden, Emma Dell, Tracy Stubbs, Nicola Bolton, Sharon Penny, Sam Roots, Beverley King, Rebecca Moher, Sharon Moher, Chrissy Bannerman, Jo Coker, Jodie Morley all from Hampshire. Julie Arnold, Janice Treasure and Mary Stanley from other counties.

SCHOOLS

This year our Schools Tournaments continue to run effectively. We held the U19's competition on Wednesday, 9th October and the U14 & U16 ran on Saturday 5th October. As always so many thanks to the HNA committee and the umpires who do such a MARVELLOUS job of running these competitions.

The finals of both U14's and U16's were contested by King Edward School, and St Swithun's. St Swithun's U16's were the only team to progress from the Regional round to National finals. The U19's competition was won by Peter Symonds who played off against a strong Portsmouth High School, both teams competed well at the Regional rounds.

For season 2025 - 2026 the planned dates for the competition are Saturday, 4th October for U14's & u16's and Wednesday, 9th October for the U19's competition. However this season, we will have the added challenge of locating a venue to host this competition. Possible options are using Wavell School, Russell Howard or, an avenue we haven't explored as yet, would be to use Places Leisure in Eastleigh for an inside event.

Last year we discussed that other counties are running for State School only participation at the end of the season. We have discussed this in our committee meetings, but Schools have not been contacted for this season. With pre planning in mind, a provisional date of Thursday, 26th March, 2026 is being proposed - venue to be confirmed. This should include Colleges/ Universities in the planning of this event and try to look for both INTO and C qualified umpires to develop good practice.

SAFEGUARDING

This season we have dealt with some referrals, but it has become clear that the role involves being more present in our Netball community. England Netball has started to publish more information about the role, making it specifically relevant to the groups we work with. They have also published a Job Description for the County Safeguarding Lead. The EN safeguarding lead is in regular contact about updates and training.



We have started to work with the team from Energise Me, their mandate is to support local Sports organisations in how they deal with safeguarding and participant welfare issues.

PERFORMANCE DEVELOPMENT PATHWAY

Coaches/ Staff

The coaches this year were Jan Crabtree and Ruth Claridge (U15's) and Chrissy Bannerman and Nikki Dunning (U13's). These are supported by Chris Granger who attends most sessions and Val Banks who keeps all of the admin up to date. Training is well attended and the athletes work hard to develop their skills and improve.

Match Play

We have had several match days with our Pulse Power Counties (Surrey, Sussex, Berkshire) and these provide invaluable match experience for our athletes.

Oxfordshire

This year has seen several positive developments in Oxfordshire Netball's competitive and organisational landscape. A new competition for the U19 age group has been successfully introduced, providing a valuable platform for older junior players to continue their progression and remain engaged in the sport. We are also exploring the re-introduction of a structured U17 competition, which would run on the same night as current U19 to bridge the gap between U15 and U19 levels, supporting player retention and offering more consistent, age-appropriate match play. Additionally, the inclusion of U11 match play within the county framework marks a positive step toward developing early competitive experience for our youngest players.

The 2025 Coaching Secretary's Report highlights ongoing support through the Oxfordshire Netball Development Board's generous bursary scheme, offering up to £142.50 for Level 1 and £300 for Level 2 coaching qualifications, with recent funding awarded to two Level 2 coaches.

Efforts are underway to launch U11 Development Hubs in Abingdon and Bicester from September 2025, targeting Year 5 and 6 girls to build netball skills and confidence, with plans to expand to four hubs over two years. Trials and training sessions will run monthly from November to May, led by experienced coaches, with financial support available. A Coaching Academy originally planned for 2025 has been postponed to 2026 due to personal circumstances and will aim to support new and progressing coaches.

The Oxfordshire COL Report (June 2024 – May 2025) reflects a successful year for officiating development in the county. Completed assessments include 8 INTO Officiating Awards, 5 C Awards (with 2–3 more learners nearly ready), and 2 B Awards. Encouragingly, learner uptake remains strong, with 57 enrolled on INTO Officiating courses, 13 on C Award, and 2 on B Award courses since June 2024. The Oxfordshire Umpire Academy, currently midway through its programme, has 16 learners progressing well toward their INTO Officiating qualifications, many showing potential to advance to the C Award in September 2025. It's particularly positive to see



Over 18 learners engaging in the pathway. Additionally, support is being developed for a small group of Over 18 learners who couldn't attend the Umpire Academy but have completed their virtual learning and now require practical experience to prepare for junior league umpiring this autumn. The report ends with a heartfelt thank you to the Oxfordshire Officiating Working Group for their continued dedication and support, with special recognition to Kate Miller for her administrative and mentoring contributions and to Deb Horne for her ongoing expertise despite personal health challenges.

Jo Kelly's 2024 Schools Tournament Report expresses gratitude to all who supported the successful County Netball Tournaments held on 9th November 2024, particularly the umpires (Team White), the organising committee, and St Helen & St Katharine School for hosting. A total of 27 teams from 14 schools participated across U14, U16, and U19 categories, with one team withdrawing. The tournaments followed a round-robin format and concluded with St Helen & St Katharine winning both the U14 and U19 sections, while Headington Rye School claimed the U16 title. All winning and runner-up teams went on to represent Oxfordshire at the Regional Rounds. Looking ahead, the 2025 County Tournaments are provisionally scheduled for Saturday 8th November 2025, with the venue to be confirmed.

The 2024–25 season saw the successful delivery of Oxfordshire's County Player Development Pathway (PDP) for both U13 and U15 age groups, each involving up to 20 athletes and running from October to May. The programmes concluded with county tournaments for both age groups, where one team from each participated. A key takeaway from this season is the need for more match play opportunities against other counties, which is being considered for the future to enhance competitive experience. This year, Oxfordshire officially transitioned from the Central Warriors to the Loughborough Lightning territory. Discussions are underway to establish an U17 PDP locally, as regular travel to Loughborough would be challenging. In an effort to address the disparity in netball exposure between independent and state school students, U11 development hubs will launch in both the north and south of the county next season. These hubs aim to build skills earlier and level the playing field for future PDP selections. Coaches interested in contributing to the programme are encouraged to get involved.

For the first time in Oxfordshire, we have welcomed boys to compete in our netball competitions. This was initially trialled with the new U11 age group and has proven successful, encouraging greater inclusivity and participation. Additionally, a male player (16) has been trialled in the Prem Plus league, with clubs responding positively to this development. While there are currently no plans to formally open the leagues to male participants at this stage, we aim to build interest over the coming years in the hope that clubs will welcome male players with open arms. Our long-term vision is to establish a dedicated male and/or mixed netball league within Oxfordshire. Monday nights continue to feature Prem 2 and U19 competitions, with Prem 2 now comprising teams from the former Prem 2 and Division 1. Meanwhile, Wednesday nights have been restructured to consolidate Divisions 2, 3, 4, and 5 into larger divisions, providing more match play opportunities across three sessions instead of two. Currently, 33 teams compete on Monday evenings and 37 teams on Wednesdays, with all six courts fully utilised during both sessions on each night. The 2024/25 season will finish off with a dedicated Celebration Day on Saturday, 12th July at St Helens & St Katherines School, Abingdon.

The day will begin with our AGM, followed by a county-wide Fun Play Day for young players in Years 4 to 9. This junior event is designed to encourage participation without the pressure of club



representation—players will register individually, and teams will be formed on the day, with experienced coaches from across Oxfordshire leading each group. Importantly, the Fun Play Day will also offer a valuable development opportunity for our trainee umpires, who will officiate the games with support and guidance from their mentors throughout the day.

The afternoon will feature the finals of the new summer competition—the Cup, Plate, and Bowl—bringing the eight-week tournament to an exciting close. We'll then celebrate the season's achievements with presentations for League Winners and Runners-Up, culminating in our inaugural OXO Awards (Oxfordshire One Awards), recognising outstanding contributions to netball across the county.

This event marks a new chapter in building community, visibility, and recognition for everyone involved in Oxfordshire Netball. Food & drink will be available for the Celebration Day, offering a meal deal to keep everyone fuelled throughout the event. All Oxfordshire Netball members attending will receive a voucher to redeem food at the trucks, as a thank-you for their involvement over the season. Accompanying parents, guardians, and siblings are welcome to purchase food on the day but will not be eligible for a free voucher.

Looking forward into 2026 and beyond, we will be further developing the U11 Hub programme. This is a key Oxfordshire initiative aimed specifically at targeting state primary schools where netball provision and delivery is currently lacking. Our goal is to provide more equitable opportunities for young players across the county, helping to build skills, confidence, and passion for netball from an earlier age.

South Bucks

We appointed a new Chairman in September 2024 and this, coupled with the continuing hard work of the committee, has put us on the front foot for 2025 and beyond. Netball is certainly thriving here in South Bucks. Our Kingsmead Netball Centre alone sees over 1,800 netballers a week through it's gates. We have 11 clubs entering around 49 teams playing in the Junior League at the weekend. We attract teams from out of county too which is great. We have two from NW London and two from Berkshire, including a new team this year.

There are about 60 teams representing 30 or so clubs in the summer/winter leagues and, in addition to all that, the centre is also used for training during the week. We also have a separate Chalfont League, outside of High Wycombe, but I haven't been supplied with numbers for that. All in all participation levels have increased from last year and one of our key focuses is to continue to improve those levels of participation for the coming season.

With more participation we will inevitably need more volunteers - whether it's Team Managers, Coaches, Safe Guarding Officials or First Aiders - and this was set out by the Chairman at our last AGM as another key focus point for the coming year. Our goal is not just to increase volunteer participation but to get more volunteers qualified in order to retain their services and create more 'buy in', as it were.

Officiating

We have had many volunteers gaining their 'Into Officiating' award in the last 12 months and we have had several C award passes and one B award pass. One of our committee members (Mel Simpson) has also qualified to be able to carry out C award assessments.

Sophia is also selected to attend the Asian Youth Games in June in South Korea she has to go there for the selection, hopefully she will be selected.
- Loughborough Lightning Seven players have attended monthly training sessions at Loughborough Lightning on Fridays, they have now been selected for the U15 Territory Futures Squad and will play against the Loughborough Lightning U15 National School squad at Motorpoint Arena, Nottingham on the 2nd May ahead of the NSL match against Loughborough Lightning and Manchester Thunder this is an amazing opportunity for them.
