Chair's Report

To my fellow RMB members and TSG officers who have again worked relentlessly for the 2023-2024 season making sure our Region is one of the most successful with a Regional Management Board and TSG officer group that is skilled, organised, passionate and driven to actively promote our Sport and support our members and embracing change when it is needed.

Officiating saw major achievements again and a special mention too, to our youth players who again did our Region proud at the National Clubs and our players across the younger age groups Roses who have been selected into the National academies as well as our main Roses squad securing the World cup silver medal, unprecedented for us as a Country. -The next phase of the Adventure Strategy, underpinning the England Netball Adventure strategy 10- year plan.

-All Counties achieving Tier 1 Governance for our Region and Counties which is mandatory for England Netball (ref: Sport England Sports Governance).

-Delivering the One Awards at the Netball South Celebration Event on 15 June 2024 which was a success.

-Delivery of the National school's regional rounds.

-Delivery of the Regional qualifiers on 8th&9th of June.

We are continuing to face real challenges in our sport due to rising cost of living which knocks on to the sport in a variety of ways including travel, facilities, kit, and we want to ask everyone to think about this and ways we can support our sport to ensure there are no financial barriers to entry; this will include Netball South asking England Netball to review the fee structure on membership and reduce this to assist our sport; Netball South will not be charging their membership element for the 4th year running.

Finally, I want to thank you, our members who we serve and look forward to another great season of netball, with final special closing to our Board, but in particular to Toni, our vice chair, and Jo, our Finance Director who work tirelessly behind the scenes with me.

Of the 27 requests 22 received were granted.



<u>Courses</u>

All umpire courses are now run online by England Netball. I know the Counties have faced a huge task in getting assessments organised for Into Officiating and C Award.

All current Assessors were required to attend an Assessor Standardisation Course, which is generally held every 4 years. I would like to thank Kim Schepens, Yvonne Jamieson and Audrey Castle for their support to Netball South in the past and have now taken the decision to step down as B Award Assessors.

World Netball have issued the 2024 Edition of Netball Rules, which will come into effect on 1 September 2024. England Netball are currently in the process of holding Webinars and are encouraging all members of EN to attend at least one session. Game Management and Contact sessions are to follow. County Officiating Leads will lead this in their Counties and all Umpires who are currently listed on the Accredited Umpires List (AUL) for Regional Umpiring have been emailed and encouraged to attend these sessions.



National highlights:

<u>NetballHER</u>

On 1st November we launched to members the first of our 4 courses as part of the NETBALLHer Learning Offer, 'The Female Body'. <u>AGM</u>

The 2023 AGM was held on Saturday 16th September in Solihull, and we were joined by a number of our valued members. This meeting marked the end of three board members' time on the board, Tracy Clarke, Debbie Ryan and Sharanjit Gulati. At the meeting the members elected two new Nominated Directors to the EN board, Serena Kersten MBE and Claire Harris. They both join the board with immediate effect along with two new Independent Directors, David Mahoney MBE and Tim Rolfe and a Co-opted Director Jill Emney. Tournaments and Events:

National and Regional One Awards

The 2023 Regional ONE Awards event was held in June at Wavell School. It was a fun filled day with plenty of faces showing up to support those up for awards. We received a new record number of nominations, over 80, with the ONE award category winners; Lisa Wayman, Liz Creighton, Stars NC, Mary Stanley, Lindsay Sartori, Laura Ellis, Sarah Wilcox, Carolyn Davies and Zoe Cheal, all being shortlisted for the National ONE Awards event in October. England Netball CEO Fran Connolly welcomed more than 264 guests to the Belfry Hotel in Sutton Coldfield and brought Vitality Roses Head Coach Jess Thirlby and Netball World Cup debutants Funmi Fadoju and Olivia Tchine to the stage to acknowledge an historic summer after the team reached their first final.

There were 23 awards presented on the evening, starting with seven recipients of the Pass on Your Passion reward and recognition scheme acknowledging the contributions of some amazing young volunteers who have logged over 400 hours of volunteering.

Our very own Mary Stanley was awarded an Honorary Life Membership at the event. A huge, and thoroughly deserved achievement. Congratulations, Mary.

England Vitality Roses:

<u>Netball World Cup 2023 -</u> England won silver at the Netball World Cup after reaching the World Cup final for the very first time in South Africa. The Vitality Roses, who beat the world number one Australia and reigning champions New Zealand on route to the final, were ultimately defeated by the Australian Diamonds 61-45 who have followed up their Commonwealth Games gold medal with a world title. England are the first team other than Australia and New Zealand to play in the World Cup final since 1995.

<u>Commonwealth Games 2023</u> - Team England beat Scotland 34-29 to secure the bronze medal in the inaugural Commonwealth Youth Games netball competition. Both sides were looking to bounce back and finish their campaign on a high after just missing out on the gold medal match.

<u>NZ Test series 2023- The Vitality Roses concluded an incredible three-match test series in which</u> the New Zealand Silver Ferns regained the Taini Jamison Trophy with a 2-1 win. For many of the players who took to court this was their first experience coming up against the world number two side and over the course of the three matches they stood up tall, silencing many overseas who had questioned their ability before seeing them shine and push the Silver Ferns across three brilliant test matches. Congratulations to the Performance team who have been working incredibly hard with the team over the past two months and will now be getting all the athletes back together to prepare for the South Africa series in December.

<u>U21 Netball Europe-</u> The England's U21s took part in the Europe Netball tournament at the UK Sports Institute in Sheffield. England took on fellow Home Nations Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales across three days of netball for the European title.

<u>Fast 5 2023</u> - The Vitality Roses won bronze at the 2023 FAST5 Netball World Series in Christchurch, New Zealand with Paige Read picking up player of the tournament.

<u>Netball Super league -</u> The new NSL season kicked off on Saturday 17 February at the Motorpoint Arena in Nottingham for the Season Opener. Building on a successful 2023 where we saw average attendances rise by 10%, we had a renewed focus going into 2024 to deliver more thrilling matches, provide enhanced experiences for fans and grow the game by taking the sport to new audiences. This year also saw the NSL secure extended broadcast contracts with BBC and Sky Sports confirming a minimum of two games would be available to watch live and on demand each week on BBC Sports and Sky Sports YouTube channels.

Regional Highlights:

<u>Oxfordshire facility refurbish</u> – The central venue league in Oxfordshire had their facility condemned preventing all leagues from playing. A huge effort between EN, the CNA and facility providers resulted in newly resurfaced courts and rejuvenated, floodlights enabling 1770 to play and benefit and returning the Oxfordshire Netball league both junior and senior to a central venue. Fantastic partnership working between staff and the ONDB and resilience demonstrated by all!



<u>NETBALLHer Implementation at local level</u> - Hampshire has been encouraging its clubs and programmes to support NETBALLHer. Ravens Netball club has fully embraced NETBALLHer organising donations from senior members to enable the Club Safeguarding Officer to make up Court Short Kits for all Level 2 coaches to support across the clubs complete playing programme. 
new Mental health and Wellbeing hub on their club website as part of their members area has aligned to NETBALLHer.

The programme had previously ran June 23 - Nov 23 - engaging 70 participants and creating 2 newly formed teams who joined the Gosport & Fareham member league. TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

Review of Netball South Accounts Year Ending 30 April 2024

We have completed a review of the records for the period ending 30 April 2024 and confirm that the accounts represent the transactions reviewed. No cash or cheque transactions were made. Only the HSBC accounts opened 2021 were in use and there were appeared to be no transactions via any other bank provider.

A sample of payments and receipts were chosen at random and comments are made as follows:

- Membership fees were minimal and totalled £3.00.
- Expenses claims were reviewed and found to be in order and as per reimbursements made.

The following items should be noted:

- 1 A large reserve in excess of £116,000 at the year end exists in the HSBC savings account.

COUNTY REPORTS

Berkshire

Berkshire Netball has enjoyed another successful year due to the work of all the amazing volunteers in the clubs and leagues throughout the county and on the Board.

Highlights are as follows:

- Berkshire Junior Netball League was once again a huge success with teams from across Berkshire and beyond enjoying regular matches at various venues across the county. Kate Maxfield, worked tirelessly together with her sub-committee to ensure that so many young players had the opportunity to compete on a regular basis.
- In addition to the winter league, a friendly summer league also took place to give teams the chance to keep playing regular netball.
- Berkshire Netball's U13 & U15 PDPs for our talented youngsters ran at St Neot's School, Eversley and Wellington Health & Fitness Centre, Crowthorne. Berkshire also hosted two Play Days and welcomed teams from Surrey and Hampshire to provide an opportunity for athletes to put into practice the skills that they were learning in their PDP sessions. We also attended the Bedfordshire Invitational PDP Tournament with teams from all over the county and finished 5th in both age groups out of 18 teams.
- We welcomed several new coaches to our PDP coaching team this year to work alongside our more experienced pathway coaches. The coaching team were- Kate Maxfield, Georgie Maxfield, Marina Bowles, Zoe O'Brien, Jacqui Cossar, Poppy Simpson, Katie Holmes and Sarah Feast.
- A number of Berkshire U15s were selected for franchise U15 Schools Games Academy programmes for Surrey Storm and Mavericks as well as for the U17 NPL and PDP squads.
- Berkshire's Performance Lead, Sarah Feast, continued to sit on the Surrey Storm Talent Management Group.
- Berkshire Netball provided a number of bursaries to support coach development at various clubs within the county.
- Berkshire's Umpiring Secretary, Mary Stanley, oversaw the development of many umpires within the county at all levels and, due to the hard work by her and her team of assessors, many umpires were successful in gaining their umpiring qualifications. There was a significant number of aspiring young umpires who attended the online Into Officiating courses and have subsequently passed their practical assessments. Many of them gained experience and were mentored at the Berkshire Junior Netball League matches during the winter and summer.
- Berkshire's NDO, Debbie Spindlow, continued to provide excellent support to the Board as well as delivering her own work programme within the county. She organised a number of EN netball programmes within the county e.g. Walking Netball, Back to Netball. She also organised a tournament for teams whose players are not currently part of a competition squad as well as a Walking Netball Tournament.
- Berkshire clubs and schools were once again very well represented at national finals of their respective competitions with Eagles going through from the Netball South competition to National Club Finals in the U16 age group (finished 5th at Nationals) and Royals going through in the U14 age group (finished 9th at Nationals). Wellington College

qualified through the county and regional rounds to go on to play at the National Schools Finals in both the U19 and U16 age group.

- Berkshire officials have once again been heavily involved with the VNSL this season fulfilling roles as technical officials/umpires etc.
- Eagles Netball Club built on the success of last year by achieving back-to-back promotions by winning promotion to the top tier of the National Premier League. Their home matches at Rivermead Leisure Centre provided an opportunity for Berkshire netballers to go along and watch some top-class netball right on their doorstep.
- Athena-Bs won a place in Div 3 regional league at play offs.
- The Board completed the Governance review as required by England Netball.

Thank you to everyone involved with netball in Berkshire and to all the amazing people who help to make all of this happen.

Hampshire

This year we continued to spend a lot of our time developing our governance and reaching the expectations of Tier 1 for governance. This is an ongoing and ever developing requirement of EN to ensure that Counties are supporting them to receive their funding from Sport England. As part of this we have had to review how we do things, our risk maps, our skill set and many other processes and documents. We are one of the only Counties in the whole of the Country to have been able to complete this work. This has been cumbersome on the Committee, will continue to take up our time and I would like to thank all for doing this and the required training that we have had to complete as well.

Last year I advised that we would be looking to focus on our strategy linked to England Netball Adventure Strategy, this has not been possible and is still an outstanding item for us, but we are also waiting for more information on this from EN and the Region before we embark on this. We have also had a quick review of our constitution and have proposed some minor amendments. What have we been doing this year – we have concentrated on consolidating our leagues and looking at how we can improve and develop these – adult and junior. We continue to look to improve these and will be having more forums with teams and umpires in the coming weeks. We have reviewed our position to the coming years subscription for Hampshire and our Treasurer will be leaving the affiliation fee as per this season. We will continue to advertise (finding different ways to get the message over) and encourage the use of bursaries and we will be reviewing our criteria in the coming year and how these work to make it easier for members.

FINANCE

Bursaries have been awarded this year as per our criteria. Our affiliation fees for 2024 – 2025 will remain at £0.50 per adult and zero per junior.

LEAGUES

The 2023-24 season has run smoothly this season for both Seniors and Juniors. This season we added an under 19 division which was well supported. It was not possible to allocate umpires this season, but this will be looked at again going forward.

Entry forms amended rules will be sent to teams and be put on the website as soon as we can confirm dates. We are currently waiting for region to confirm their dates

Shooting Stars won Division one and will be the team to represent Hampshire in the play offs for Regional Division 3. Pulse Premier U19 will represent Hampshire in the Under 19 Regional Entry Tournament.

Again, this year we ran the National Schools.

UMPIRING

This year has continued to be a difficult year for Officiating for the County as well as for leagues. There is a lack of experienced umpires and those looking to develop their skills offering to do Hampshire Games and I know for leagues that the lack of grass roots umpires continues to cause issues of being able to cover matches.

An Officiating Technical Support Group was established this year and we have been working with leagues to support them. The group includes Gary Holden who has been particularly working with Portsmouth and Gosport and Fareham and Holly Buddle who is part of the Andover League. We will be continuing to try and develop umpires' skills over the next year.

We have been assessing umpires as quickly as we can – you have all been crying out for more umpires and I am pleased to advise that from April 23 to end March 24 we have had 19 new C Award umpires. This continues to be a drop in numbers to what we were seeing pre COVID. In addition, we have had 57 umpires pass their Into Officiating awards which is twice as many as last year.

As you may be aware all courses are now run by EN online and to become an umpire you must firstly complete an Into Officiating Course and assessment and then do your C Award Course. Over 330 people in Hampshire have already done the Into Officiating. Unfortunately, in the same period only 69 people have subsequently booked on to a C Award course and I will be working with umpires to see what we can do to support more moving to this next stage. I am aware that a number of leagues are doing all they can to encourage this as well and holding specific events during the summer season to get more people involved in umpiring. In the same period only 11 people are looking to do the B award most of whom were existing C umpires.

We are aware that the cost of becoming an umpire have now increased from the 1st April and would ask leagues to continue to support those working to the Into Officiating level and remind people that the county does have bursaries to assist for C and above.

We now have 5 new Assessors within Hampshire, Sam Roots, Jo Coker, Jodie Morley, Rebecca Moher and Sharon Moher. All the new assessors are able to assess Into Officiating and are working towards becoming C award assessors.

I would like to thank all the assessors who have supported me and continue to do so, Chris Grainger, Christine Backshell, Mandy Gerrard, Gary Holden, Emma Dell, Tracy Stubbs, Nicola Bolton and Sharon Penny all from Hampshire. Julie Arnold, Janice Treasure and Marty Stanley from other counties.

Finally, we know that there have been a number of Rule Clarifications being introduced from September 2024. I am working with leagues to provide forums and opportunities for umpires and players to learn about the changes, but I would also like to direct people to watch the videos that World Netball have made which are really helpful and take any opportunities you can to attend sessions provided by England Netball which will be run from May to September.

<u>SCHOOLS</u>

This year our schools' tournaments run effectively, we held the U19's competition on Wednesday 11th October and the U14 & U16 ran on Saturday 7th October. As previously minuted the winners of the U19 competition were St Swithun's and Runners up were Barton Peveril. Barton Peveril had a very successful year, also qualifying to attend the AoC National Championships. Their girls represent a number of different Hampshire clubs, and we wish them well.

The winners of the U16 competition were KES, Southampton and runner up were St Swithun's. The winners of the U14 competition were St Swithun's & runners up KES, Southampton. St Swithun's U14 made the National finals and came 13th overall in the Finals competition. We at HNA are incredibly proud of all the schools' participation.

It has been brought our attention again that the IoW schools should be attending our county tournament rather than entering directly into the regional tournament. We will advise the IoW contact this term of the dates that have been set for 24-25 season. U19 date is Wednesday 9th Oct and U14 & U16 is Saturday 5th October.

It has been brought to my attention that both Sussex and Surrey are running tournaments for State school only participation at the end of the season and I wonder if this something we should be working with our NDA and other coaching partnerships to offer.

SAFEGUARDING

The number of referrals to me have increased, coaches and volunteers are being scrutinised in a way we haven't really seen in Netball before. There are a number of reasons for this, but we have started to work with Sarah Goddard from Energise Me who has been appointed as a Hampshire Safeguarding and Wellbeing officer. Her mandate is to support organisations in how they deal with safeguarding and participant welfare issues.

We would like to invite her to talk to us about how she can support us further, plus link our local leagues to her services moving forward.

PERFORMANCE DEVELOPMENT PATHWAY

• Coaches/ Staff

The coaches this year were Jan Crabtree and Ruth Claridge (U15's) and Chrissy Bannerman and Nikki Dunning (U13's). These are supported by Chris Granger who attends most sessions and Val Banks who keeps all of the admin up to date. Training is well attended, and the athletes work hard to develop their skills and improve.

Match Play

We have had several match days with our Surrey Storm Counties (Surrey, Sussex, Berkshire) with the U15 squads only losing one match and the U13's winning their final event.

We ran an 'open evening' offering junior club coaches an opportunity to visit the academy to see the standard of players and understand the selection process prior to nominating athletes for trials. This was received positively by the coaches in attendance.

• Parents Meetings

A meeting was held at the start and finish of the academy. The role that the County plays in the performance pathway was explained and parents were given opportunity to ask questions. At the final U15 session the current National landscape was explained with the fact that all NSL teams have re-applied for their place next season and as, yet we do not know who has been successful. C Award – 16 umpires have attended a C award course; 2 umpires are due to attend a C award course between May and June 2024.

B Award – 1 umpire has attended a B award course, 1 umpire is due to attend a B award course starting in May 2024.

Completed Assessments Into Officiating – 28 umpires achieved Into Officiating Level. C Award – 14 umpires achieved C Award Level B Award – 2 umpires achieved B Award Level A Award – 1 umpire achieved A award Level

Special mention and congratulations to Laura Stunell (B), Ellie Balchin (B) & Megan Pratt (A) for achieving their B & A awards. An incredible achievement and very well deserved given the dedication and work that you have put into your umpiring this season.

Kate Miller, the County treasurer, gave an overview of the support the County has given to the many bursary applications. Venue costs and travel costs have increased hugely, and it is an agenda item for future meetings as Sussex will struggle to continue this level of support in the years to come.
