This post is to coach netball under the leadership of the Head of Girls' Games who has overall responsibility for the delivery of girl's games. The games programme is supported by a number of specialist and academic staff.

Responsibilities

- To communicate effectively with all other games' staff.
- To keep up to date with rules and coaching methods.

Coaching

Coaching sessions take place during the School day with matches predominantly on Wednesdays and Saturdays with Under 9 fixtures being played on Tuesday afternoons.

- Coaching of netball at U8-U13 level, with the possibility of continuation into the summer term for cricket coaching of U8-U13.
- To umpire matches.
