

CAPs Clubs

CAPS is going ONLINE!

From March 2017, the only way CAPS Accreditations will be awarded is through an online process where clubs work with their NDOs and Regional Coordinators to complete and upload forms and evidence to an online portal. This is a new process, so there will be teething problems throughout the first few Months. Please be patient with our staff throughout this period.

Assessment Deadlines: There will be an assessment week every month where clubs will be able to send in their online submissions. This is assessed regionally, and then nationally, before receiving confirmation of accreditation, certificates or a list of outstanding evidence. The Assessment week will be the 1st –7th of each Month, if you were to miss an assessment week, you will only have to wait three weeks until the next.

The first assessment week will be on 1st —7th May 2017. Please complete online submissions before or during this week.

CAPS FAQs

Can our club complete our accreditation by folder assessment?

Unfortunately not, the final folder assessment was in March, we can now only process accreditations/ reaccreditations/upgrades on the online portal.

When does our club need a site visit?

A site visit is when your Netball Development Officer visits your club, looks through your documents and ensures you are working as your evidence says you are. This needs to be completed before the online portal upload. It is best to have all your evidence/documentation collected before the site visit takes place.

Can we have a site visit before our paperwork is completed?

Due to scheduling and other reasons, you might have to have your site visit before you have completed your paperwork, this however isn't the best way to do it as your NDO's will be able to look at your paperwork and give feedback before you upload.

If we are unsuccessful, how long do we have to provide new or updated evidence?

This will not change from the folder assessments, you will have a month (up until the next assessment period) to supply us with additional evidence requested.

If we have missed a submission or have been working towards for sometime, but are yet to submit , at what point could our CAPS accreditation be revoked?

If your CAPS is overdue by more than 6 months, we will begin the process of revoking your CAPS accreditation (please note this is flexible and will be looked at on an individual club basis.). Many clubs go through difficult periods, for example committee changes or restructures. If this is the case please let your NDO know and they will be able to help you. If there are any other reasons why you are struggling with CAPS, make us aware.

Can we upload evidence sporadically or out of order?

No—the online portal only allows you to upload in order. It is therefore suggested that you collect all paperwork/evidence and then begin to upload it. We recommend storing all paperwork and evidence on a memory stick or folder on a computer until you are ready to upload.

We are a Bronze/Silver club who have more than 2/4 coaches, do we need all of their certificates?

All coaches need to be on your Work Force Matrix, however you only need certification evidence of 2 (for bronze) and 4 (for silver) of your coaches. You need a minimum of $1 \times L1$ and $1 \times L2$ (for bronze) and $2 \times L1$ and $2 \times L2$ (for silver).

My club need to register as a Working Towards CAPS Club, where can we do this?





Back to Netball Case Studies

With Back to Netball in South Bucks growing, we spoke to Gemma and Sian from Back to Netball Sessions and Leagues in Bucks to find out what they think about Back to Netball and why you should join!

<u>Gemma</u>

1. How did you find out about Back to Netball in South Bucks?

I found out about B2N through one of my neighbours.

- 2. What is your favourite thing about a Back to Netball Session?
- My favourite thing about the sessions is how relaxed and fun they can be. There has never been any pressure to be good at a skill straight away and the coaches are great at taking you through the different elements step-by-step.
 - 3. Why did you decide to give Back to Netball a go?
- I have been into sport all my life and when I started B2N, I was also new to the area, I was looking for something which could keep me fit, but at the same time be fun and social. B2N has definitely hit all three!
 - 4. If someone was considering taking up Back to Netball, what would you say to them?



I'd say definitely do it or at least give it a go! No matter how long ago you played, it's surprising how quickly you can pick things back up. Having only played netball through PE lessons in school, I didn't think netball was all that fun. B2N has definitely changed my mind on that and now I can't get enough of it!

5. What has been your Back to Netball Journey, from stepping onto the court for the first time, to now?

I started off in a small session where there was usually about 3-4 of us. I don't think I knew very many of the rules and could never get my footwork quite right (still working on this!). I now go to the B2N sessions 2-3 times a week and feel so much more confi-

dent in my playing ability. I've met so many new people and have managed to develop

and become part of a new team which currently plays in a B2N league. Through playing in the league, I've even started to learn how to umpire!

6. Have you taken up any other netball roles since becoming a Back to Netballer?

Since becoming a B2Netballer I now co-captain a team in the B2N league and am learning how to umpire.

7. What's your favourite position to play?

I think my favourite position would have to be centre but I do occasionally like to play goal attack when luck is on my side!









Back to Netball Case Studies



<u>Sian</u>



1. How did you find out about Back to Netball in South Bucks?

Through a friend who played for her university netball team. She wanted to get back in to netball, and I was bored of going to the gym and convincing myself 20 minutes of walking on the treadmill counted as exercise. I had played netball at school but hadn't played since and was keen to get back in to an actual sport rather than doing aimless sessions of walking around the gym!

2. What is your favourite thing about a Back to Netball Session?

Probably the social side and making new friends, as well as feeling like I've really exercised for an hour – I feel like I've actually achieved!!!

3. Why did you decide to give Back to Netball a go?

I really wanted to get back in to the sport after a break of about 10 years, having last played in high school. A team sport was

- much more appealing than going to the gym.
 - 4. If someone was considering taking up Back to Netball, what would you say to them?

Go to your first session and then keep going! Even when you feel like you're a bit rubbish at it, don't worry, just keep playing for the fun! And as a bonus it's good for you and you might even make some new friends.

5. What has been your Back to Netball Journey, from stepping onto the court for the first time, to now?

I started off at quite a small session, re-learning the rules and the types of pass, working through practicing some defending and shooting. I started going to two sessions a week after sessions started at my local leisure centre. Back to Netball ran a small scale Sunday morning tournament, and a few of us decided to give it a go. We came (joint!) third out of nine teams so not



bad for our first outing! After taking part in the mini tournament we decided to enter the back to netball league as Wycombe Wolves. We're four or five games in now and are not doing too badly.

6. Have you taken up any other netball roles since becoming a Back to Netballer?



As the Back to Netball league involves each team providing scorers, umpires and timers, as well as playing, I have started learning to umpire. I am very much a beginner at this at the moment but hope to take some of the umpiring tests in the future.

7. What's your favourite position to play?

I quite like playing goal attack – you get the freedom to move around a bit and you can shoot. Turns out I'm not as terrible at shooting as I thought I was when I was at school!



Remembering Lisa Wise



Lisa Wise sadly passed away on April 2nd after a short battle with Ovarian Cancer. She spent her last few days in the Duchess of Kent Hospice in Reading where she was with her family and the most compassionate staff. Lisa was a loving wife, an inspirational mother to three sons and a netball coach/leader/mentor/genius to so many in Berkshire.



Lisa was more commonly known as 'Netball Lisa' among the netball world. Her passion for the sport was astounding, she had a vision to make netball accessible to all and she made that a reality; she fought for new courts to be built in the local community and was frequently heard on the local radio promoting and talking all things netball. Lisa was the founder of Laurel Park Netball Club, starting out with a few Mums who watched football on the side lines. It quickly grew into a club of well over 100 members ranging from 6-60 and teams in division 4 through to the Premier League. Her mission was to encourage anyone and everyone to play and she certainly achieved this. Lisa built 8 teams within Laurel Park, ran mixed charity events, made regular appearances on the radio and even had a debut on BBC's The One Show. Lisa really was an incredible woman, she has touched so many people's lives with her kindness, generosity, happiness and positivity for well, everything!

As well as being a mum, wife and working full time, she was on the committee for Berkshire Premier Netball League, Bracknell District Netball League and was the media correspondent for Berkshire netball. She was also working her way towards her Level 3 coaching qualification and volunteered for England Netball developing grassroots. You could guarantee if netball was mentioned, Lisa would be there!



Lisa's family and the club are keen not to let her passing be in vain. Her legacy will live on through all the girls in Laurel Park and they will continue to wear black and red with pride. However, the family and the club's efforts now turn to promoting awareness of Ovarian Cancer. Fundraising events will be held regularly and awareness of the signs and symptoms will be promoted with support from Target Ovarian Cancer.
